

### UTSALADY MILL IN 1883, CAMANO ISLAND

This artist's shoreline view is a bit distorted but shows early tall ships, a steamboat and another with the paddlewheel at the stern. Utsalady was an active harbor from 1858 until 1891. Other buildings include the bunkhouse, granary, and "Deer Park". Ships and other boats were manufactured along with spars and lumber. Seven vessels were built between 1861 and 1873, one was the J. B. Libby similar to the one with the sidewheel in the foreground. Utsalady had a population of about 200-446 millworkers and others between 1895 and 1900. This adds to other views of Utsalady we have to help document this mill that had its own fascinating history.

### **OVENELL'S DRIVE IN**

Ovenell's Drive in opened in August 1955 and closed in 1982. It was one of two early "fast food" businesses in Stanwood. The other was the Farmette located where McDonalds is now near Haggens. In the background of the photograph are the elaborate processing pipes for the Twin City Foods. After 1982, it became a travel agency and /or insurance company owned and operated by various companies. (undated and unattributed)

Above: Governor Albert Dean Rosellini (1910—2011) served as governor from Jan 1957 until Jan 1965. In August 1960 the *News* documented a visit from the Governor to Twin City Foods, where many people were employed and farmers sold their crops. Known mostly for his advocacy and as the namesake for the Evergreen Floating Bridge. The span, which carries State Route 520 across Lake Washington from Seattle to Medina, opened on Aug. 28, 1963. ### Senator Slade Gorton (1928-2020)

Washington State Senator visited Stanwood for the Fourth of July celebration in 1984. Gorton was elected Attorney General of the State of Washington in 1968. He served with distinction in that office until 1981 "In the U.S. Senate, Slade was an influential member of the Armed Services Committee... and was an important voice in pushing for the clean-up of Hanford, and he fought for health care, the arts and transportation solutions. He worked to keep orca whales out of captivity and in Washington's waters.

Our photograph collection includes many of those received in 1992 from Cliff and Shirley Danielson, publishers of the *Stanwood News*. They had received them from many early residents and used them to publish "Stanwood Story" by Alice Essex. Many of the John Wagness photographs that were used in the *Stanwood Story* were included and supplemented many original prints given to us by Kenneth Wagness and other donors. Ivy Hansen donated the negatives of her husband Howard Hansen that he took in the late 1950s until 1983 when he died.

In 2021 we received hundreds of additional negatives from the *Stanwood Camano News*. The negatives are from photographs that were taken in the late 1950s through the early 1980s.

We appreciate this gift to remind us of our history as the *News* continues to cover contemporary current day business, politics, people, organizations from Camano Island, Warm Beach, Cedarhome, Florence, Silvana, Victoria and Freeborn as well as Stanwood. **We thank** these and **many, many other** donors of our community photographs for use in exhibits, programs and publications now and into the future.




### Above: The Gleaner picking up oats and passengers.

It is haying season and this is what it looked like in the 1890s. The steamer the "Gleaner" is docked at granary wharf where wagons with sacked oats are waiting to store or to load at the Stanwood Grain Co. at the waterfront. This granary was located at the mouth of the Stillaguamish River near the fork of West & South Pass.


### Keeping our Museum Open!

We are hoping that by the 4<sup>th</sup> of July you will see a major



Check out our school exhibit on the third floor of the Floyd Norgaard Cultural Center along with other new features about logging.



The students learned about the giant fir log cross section in front yard of the Pearson House. It was cut down in 1928 by Rasmus Larsen and Ole Odegard and other English Lumber Company employees Joe Haugen, Oscar Kively and Ole Lervick. It was felled near Lake Cavanaugh and remains as a symbol of the large trees once in the area. It stood near the East Stanwood viaduct for many years before it was moved to the Pearson House yard in 1992. The Lions Club transported it to this location, sanded off the graffiti and constructed the new shelter.
